Feeding God's people is an especially important part of who we are as Vincentians. Daily we meet clients who do not have sufficient groceries for their families. Our Pantry volunteers work every day, securing food, stocking our shelves, packing grocery bags, and distributing those groceries to those who come to us for assistance.



It is a common site, early in the morning to see the Pantry van backing up to the building to unload the food that has been donated from various sources: Rogue Manor, Ray's, Safeway, Gleaners, and food which is ordered from local distributors; Dollar Store, WinCo,

and US Foods.

Often when Pantry volunteers have any extra time, they find their way to the Kitchen to help with Lunch. Where they are always warmly welcomed.



St. Anthony Emergency Family Shelter



Our *St Anthony Emergency Family Shelter* has been a temporary respite for many families, especially after the years impacted by COVID and the loss of so many homes from the horrific fire of 2020. Though we still had incidents of individuals and in some cases, families having to leave the shelter prematurely due to drug or alcohol use or inappropriate conduct, there were many successes as well.

We had a large family of ten and several other families of varying sizes, who were able to move on to more permanent housing or have returned to other family members. Two of those families stand out as successes in their search for housing.

One family of six secured housing after experiencing domestic violence and abuse with less than thirty days stay in our shelter, which is the stay limit without a goal assessment. The mother was motivated and relieved without the domestic abuse and violence threat no longer hanging over her and her family of five well-behaved children. They left our shelter with hopes for a better and more predictable life.

The other family, a mother and young son, was with us for quite a while longer with the mother working toward a goal of finding housing through Jackson County Housing Authority. She was finally able to get the housing she needed and was so very appreciative of the safety of our shelter and the services she received. I recently had the privilege of encountering her and her son with their extended family while shopping at Costco. She saw me before I saw her, she walked up to

me and said thank you again for her stay at our shelter. She felt confident and secure with her son in their new place as we hugged. Then the 7-year-old boy ran up to me and gave me a big hug and said, "I know you". He hugged me for a long time and then he said, "Thank you." Later, with my shopping done, I left Costco with a smile on my face and an uplifted feeling in my heart.

The *St Anthony Emergency Family Shelter* has been an active part of St. Vincent de Paul for over twenty years in three separate locations, thanks to founder Dr Dave Moosman and Al Zon, as well as Kathy Fisher, Kathy Begley, Nancy Morrow, Nick Koutosouros and Scott Gustafson. It is with great pride and massive humility that I thank them all for all they do to make this an oasis in life's journey for so many struggling families.
